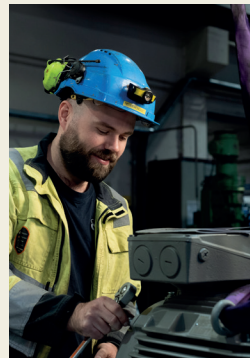
It's great to have you with us!

2019

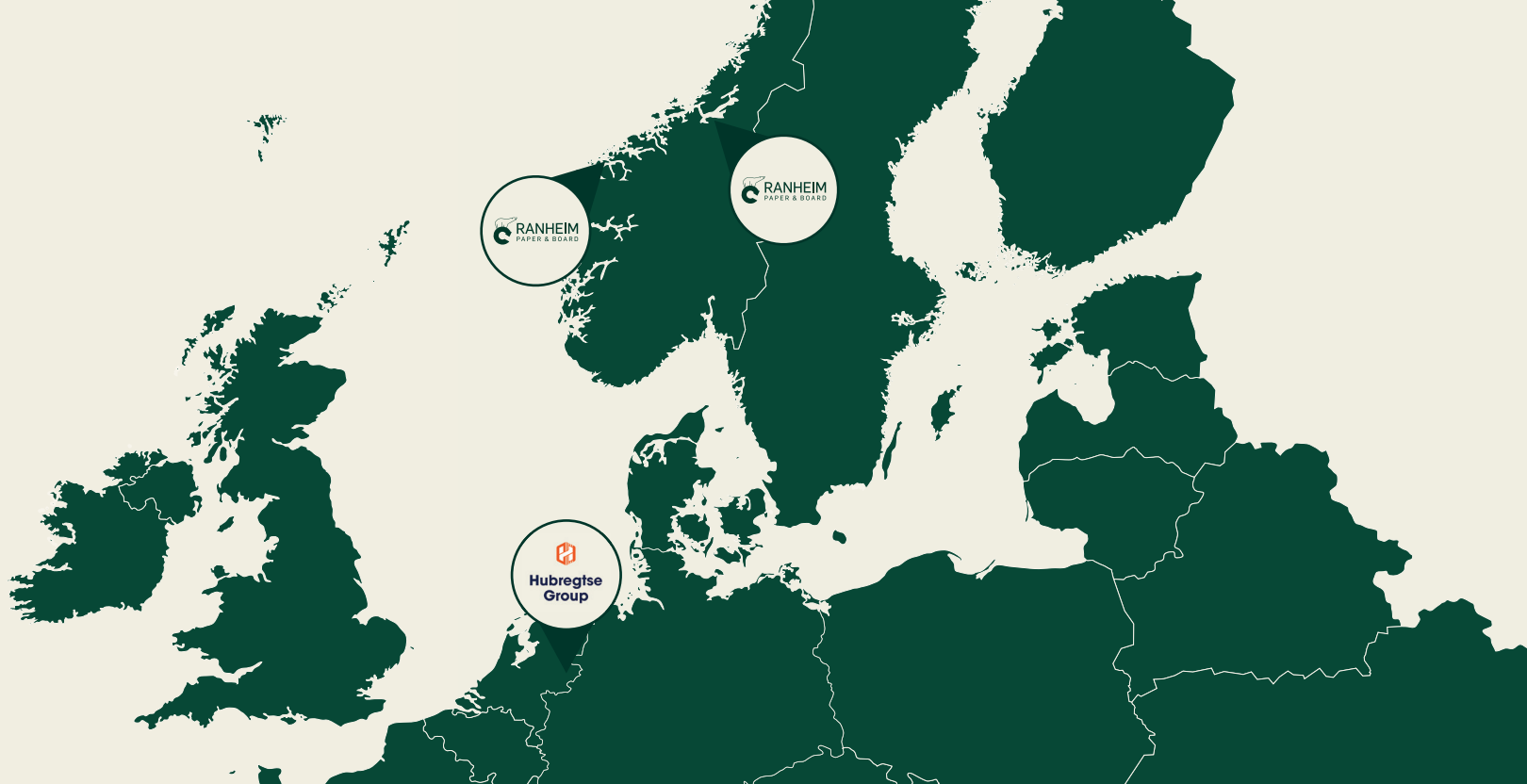
Merger Ranheim and West Pack to Ranheim Paper & Board.

Ranheim Paper & Board is situated in Trondheim, Norway. This site is centrally positioned and house both paper and solid board production facilities. Additionally, we have a solid board production site in Ålesund.

In 2023, as part of our expansion efforts, we acquired Hubregtse in Almelo, Netherlands. This acquisition encompasses a solid board production company equipped with lamination and printing solutions.

Ranheim Paper & Board has been using 100% recyclable paper since 1981.

Every year, our factory transforms 130,000 tonnes of old, used corrugated boxes into new, high-quality paper and solid board products. This volume corresponds to around 50% of the corrugated cardboard collected in Norway each year.



1 tonne
